

As a school district we have set a target that 80% of our graduating seniors take an advanced placement course by the time that they graduate high school because the rigor of this experience helps students achieve success after high school. Glenbard's Board of Education has committed to this goal.

#### AP Student Success at the College Level Resource: The Benefits of AP

We offer 25 Advanced Placement Courses at South, an amazing number. Some of these courses are open to students as early as their freshman year of high school. However, the most important goal of taking an AP class is taking one before your graduate in a subject area the student is excited about. As we approach the time in which students are signing up for courses, I encourage you to have conversations with your student so that they pick a rigorous yet attainable course schedule, plan to take classes that they have a passion or interest in, and finally, make a four year plan that includes at least one AP class. We will be hosting an AP Information night on Thursday, November 29, starting at 6:30 p.m. This is a great opportunity to learn from counselors, parents, students, and college admission officers about AP and how it leads to success in high school and college. This is a great evening for parents/students interested in AP courses for the first time.

#### New Courses @ South 2019-2020 School Year

Latin American History (1 Semester- Eligible Students Grades 10-12): Latin American History is a semester elective course that explores the Latin American experience from the pre-colonial period to contemporary 21st Century America. Students will explore Latin America's rich diversity that includes Mesoamerica, South America and the Caribbean. This exploration includes a cultural and historical perspective to better understand the experiences and processes that have shaped the region. Questions: Contact Mrs. Rita Guritz.

#### **3D Design 2** (1 Semester - Grades 9-12):

This course strand consists of two levels focused on three-dimensional (3D) approaches to artmaking. Through 3D1 & 3D2, students will experience various ways to creatively activate space, integrate depth and space, and create volume and surface. Students will demonstrate an understanding of 3D design through an array of processes under the 3D umbrella. These may include but are not limited to: ceramics, functional art, figurative and/or non-figurative sculpture, architectural models, 3D printing, modeling for animation, jewelry, metalworking, glasswork, assemblage, 3D fabric/fiber arts, mixed-media, installation, and performance. #### **Testing Dates - Spring 2019**

**Tuesday, April 9**: All Juniors in Illinois take the SAT. This is now a graduation requirement. Freshman, Sophomores, and Seniors will not have school on Tuesday, April 9.

Wednesday, April 10: Freshman will take the state mandated PSAT 8/9 exam and

sophomores will take the state mandated PSAT 10 exam. Juniors and seniors will not have school on Wednesday, April 10 (Good college visit day). Some juniors who are eligible for extended time on the SAT may be testing on both April 9 and 10.

#### **SAT Prep Classes**

We will again be offering free SAT Prep classes to Juniors. These classes are free of charge and will begin in January leading up to the April 9 SAT test. 4.EXAM MAKE-UP - Students who have an excused absence from an exam may make arrangements with their teacher to make up the exam on Friday, 12/21/18 during the Exam Make-up Session. Students may also arrange with teachers to make up exams during Resource Periods.

5.TECHNOLOGY CENTER OF DUPAGE - TCD 1st semester ends on December 20, 2018.

6.QUIET STUDY AREAS - Supervised quiet study areas will be available in the Commons and the LRC for those students who wish to study during the exams, when they have a free period. All Physical Education and Driver Education classes WILL MEET ON EXAM DAYS. No students will be allowed in the halls without a pass during the exam periods. All students are to remain in their classes during the entire period.

7.RESCHEDULED EXAMS - Students who feel they have a heavy load of exams on Wednesday and Thursday, may elect to change or move one of their exams to the Rescheduled/Makeup time slot on Friday 12/21. This change should be arranged with their individual teacher no later than one week prior to the beginning of exams.

8.ZERO HOUR P.E. EXAM - Zero hour Physical Education's final exam will be taken on Friday, December 21st from 10:45am to 12:10pm.

9.SCHOOL CODE - School Code requires that Districts schedule a minimum of 300 minutes of instruction and student support during the last day of each academic semester. Passing periods do not count toward the 300 minutes requirement.

10.SENIOR EXAMS - Seniors scheduled to graduate at semester are required to take semester exams if the graduating student is in danger of failing the course or the final examination is considered an indispensable part of the course. A memo will be sent to teachers of these Seniors in November. The last day of attendance for these Seniors will be Tuesday, December 18, 2018.

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#### FirstView Bus Rider APP Available Now

I want to inform you of a new app for students that ride a First Student bus in the morning or afternoon. The FirstView app is a great option for students and parents that ride a bus to or from Glenbard South. Benefits of the app include:

\* Live Tracking of your bus - The FirstView<sup>™</sup> map screen shows you the live location and direction of your bus, your stop schedule for the current day and timestamps for school arrivals and departures.

\* Custom Alerts & Messages - The app can be set-up to notify you when your bus is a chosen distance from your stop.

#### It's Time for Your Annual Flu Shot

DUPAGE COUNTY - Influenza (flu) season in Illinois typically starts in the fall, and the DuPage County Health Department is recommending that everyone six months and older be vaccinated against influenza.

The Health Department suggests that residents check with their physician's office or local pharmacy for the availability of flu vaccine. The single most effective way to prevent getting the flu is an annual flu shot. Influenza is a serious illness and can be fatal. Even healthy people get the flu each year, so it's important for everyone to be vaccinated. Protecting yourself from flu also protects the people around you who are more vulnerable to serious flu illness. When more people get vaccinated against the flu, less flu can spread through that community. Flu season can last as late as May. Flu causes millions of illnesses, hundreds of thousands of hospitalizations and thousands or sometimes tens of thousands of deaths. Flu hit children hard last season with 183 lab-confirmed influenza-associated pediatric deaths reported nationally. Approximately 80 percent of these deaths occurred in children who had not received a flu vaccination this season. In addition to getting a flu shot, the Health Department recommends following the 3 Cs: \* **Clean** - frequently wash your hands with soap and warm water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcoholbased hand rub. \* **Cover** - cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. After using a tissue, throw it in the trash and wash your hands. \* **Contain** - contain your germs by staying home if you are sick except to get medical care or for other necessities.

Influenza antiviral drugs can be a second line of defense for treatment of some who get sick with flu. Many observational studies have found that in addition to lessening the duration and severity of symptoms, antiviral drugs can help prevent flu complications. Because it is important to start antiviral medication quickly, high-risk patients should contact a healthcare professional at the first signs of influenza symptoms, which include sudden onset of fever, sore throat or cough, body aches, chills, and tiredness.
