- 4. EXAM MAKE-UP Students who have an excused absence from an exam may make
- arrangements with their teacher to make up the exam on Friday during the Exam Make-up

Session. Students may also arrange with teachers to make up exams during Resource Periods.

- 5. TECHNOLOGY CENTER OF DUPAGE The last day of student attendance is Wednesday, May 23rd.
- 6. QUIET STUDY AREAS Supervised quiet study areas will be available in the commons and the LRC for those students who wish to study during the exams, when they have a free period. All Physical Education and Driver Education classes WILL MEET ON EXAM DAYS. There are to be no students in the halls without a pass during the exam periods. All students are to remain in their classes during the entire period.
- 7. RESCHEDULED EXAMS Students who feel they have a heavy load of exams on Day 1 or Day 2, the days we have three exams, may elect to change or move one of their exams to the Rescheduled/Makeup time slot on Friday, May 31st. This change should be arranged with their individual teacher no later than one week prior to the beginning of exams.
- 8. ZERO HOUR PE EXAM Zero hour Physical Education's final exam will be taken on Friday, May 31st from 10:45am to 12:10pm.
- 9. SCHOOL CODE School Code requires that Districts schedule a minimum of 300 minutes of instruction and student support during the last day of each academic semester. Passing periods do not count toward the 300 minute requirement.
- 10. PRE-ARRANGED ABSENCE If a student is planning on being absent for final exams, he/she should turn in a note to the attendance office and have a meeting with the Assistant Principal for Instruction for approval.

The Glenbard Parent Series has selected the critically acclaimed novel, Killers of the Flower Moon: The Osage Murders and the Birth of the FBI by David Grann as the 2019 GPS Community-Wide Read.

In Killers of the Flower Moon, David Grann revisits a shocking series of crimes in which dozens of people were murdered in cold blood. Based on years of research and startling new evidence, the book is a masterpiece of narrative nonfiction, as each step in the investigation reveals a series of sinister secrets and reversals. But more than that, it is a searing indictment of the callousness and prejudice toward American Indians that allowed the murderers to operate with impunity for so long.
