Raider Rush

Link Crew

Link Crew is a student led organization that assists new students in their transition to high school and provides key information to help Freshmen navigate Glenbard South. Our student leaders are natural leaders at Glenbard South. They are well vetted through a comprehensive interview with staff and administration. Leaders are selected based on their ability to show respect for others and value diverse ideas and personalities, their willingness to lead and take risks, their ability to be a positive role model, and their overall interest in helping others. Link Crew creates a structure that connects every new student with a caring upperclassman. Students that successfully transition and connect to school are better equipped to succeed; specifically with maintaining grades, higher attendance rate, and minimal discipline infractions. We offer comprehensive co-curricular activities, athletics, and special events based on student interest and for improved connection.

For most schools, the challenge comes in getting information to new students in an accurate and timely manner. Link Crew provides a way for student leaders to disseminate information through the student-to student connection both one on one and in small groups. It is far more likely that school specific information is received and remembered via the Link Crew.

Registration and Fees

Glenbard utilizes an on-line registration process for families. Please refer to the "On-Line Registration" flyer found in the registration packet. Both parent/guardian and student will be required to approve on-line policies and terms/conditions. Glenbard's Student Fee Schedule is located under the Parents section of the website.

The required fees for all Glenbard South students are:

• \$235 - Registration Fee (Prompt pay fee of \$200 if paid in full on or before

August 1, 2019)

- \$149 iPad Rental Fee
- \$85 Digital Curriculum Fee

\$24 - PE uniform and lock will be provided to all incoming freshmen for online payment. Students will be able to purchase PE uniforms and lock once school is in session during PE class.

\$150 - Athletic participation fee allows your student to participate in unlimited

sports.

iPad information

All incoming freshmen will be issued an iPad to manage coursework. The annual rental fee for the iPad, case, insurance and loaner program is \$149 per year, per student. Freshman students are eligible for this fee due to the reduced cost of the iPad from our vendor.

Digital Curriculum/App Fee

Students will be required to pay an \$85 annual digital curriculum/App fee that covers the costs of

all digital curriculum (digital textbooks, digital novels, digital workbooks) and applications (Schoology, our learning management system; etc.) that the student will use for their coursework.

Note: Certain courses may still require non-digital materials (hard-bound textbooks; paperback novels or workbooks). If your student is provided these non-digital materials, they will be provided at no additional charge. Textbooks must be returned by the student in good condition at semester end (semester classes) or by year end (year-long classes), or fines could apply.

Here are some important reminders:

- School counselors do not accept teacher requests.
- Per school board policy, April 30th is the deadline for any "change of mind" request. The only schedule adjustments that can be made are due to extenuating circumstances or schedule conflicts.
- Please keep in mind that students' class schedules are not considered final until the first day of school. It is not uncommon for shifts in a student's schedule to occur. School counselors continue to review incomplete and incorrect schedules.
- Although we do our best to reduce interruptions to a student's schedule, there may be situations where a student has a different teacher 1st and 2nd semester. Our teachers work hard to build positive relationships with all students so as to ease the transition.
- The School Counseling office will be open on August 6th and August 7th to answer any questions.

Instructional Insider

Glenbard South is committed to ALL students and we want to provide many opportunities for academic support for our students. These are a few of the supports to take advantage of right away at the start of the school year. We are here to help you!

Academic Resources at South

Math Lab: The Math Lab provides tutoring support to students to help them better understand homework assignments and how to prepare for examinations. Students can also use the Math Lab for help with skill deficits or to make corrections on work.

Writing Center: Writing Center South is located in the LRC. It is open daily during lunch periods to assist students with any writing assignment at any point in the writing process. Students can make an appointment through our Schoology page, Writing Center South, or walk in. They are encouraged to use Google docs to share their work ahead of time and may also receive assistance using Google docs if time does not permit a face-to-face meeting.

Academic Support Center: Students are able to use their study hall time to receive academic support and address key needs such as targeted skill support and follow through on missed assignments. Teacher assistance is available in the Library Resource Room. Students are placed in Study Hall Resource as a result of failing grades.

Professional Learning Communities (PLCs)

Every Monday Glenbard South students will be dismissed at 1:52 p.m. to allow teachers time to meet in collaborative groups. Regular bus service will be provided for students, including extra-curricular and athletic buses.

During second semester last year, a committee of more than 60 people participated in three work sessions as a part of the Profile of a Graduate process. 

iPad information

Returning students that were issued an iPad are responsible for maintaining their device in good working order and will use their device for the upcoming 2019-2020 school year. Returning students are expected to bring their device to Back-to-School Days for an "iPad readiness" inspection. Students should run all software updates in advance to help expedite this process.

*After the family has made 4 annual rental payments over the student's career at Glenbard and the student's account is paid in full, the device will become the property of the student; in other words this is a "rent to own" program.

Digital Curriculum/App Fee

AP Cafe: The Advanced Placement (AP) Café/Student Center is open to all students enrolled in an AP course. Students looking for help with an Advanced Placement class, interested in forming a study group or just looking for a quiet place to study should visit the AP Café during school hours.

Advanced Placement Courses

Major changes are occurring this year with AP. Starting in 2019-20 schools will implement new annual processes and have access to new classroom resources and supports. AP Exams will be ordered in the fall (2019) via a new registration and ordering system.

Teachers and students will receive free course and exam preparation resources, including question banks, personal progress checks, and performance feedback. To learn more, visit the <u>AP 2019 page</u>. At the beginning of the school year, students will sign in to their college board account. If students do not have an account, they will need to <u>create an account</u>. A join code will be provided to you from your teacher so students can enroll in their class section.

The fee for each AP Exam your student will take this year has not changed from last year and is \$94 (with the exception of AP Seminar and AP Research which cost \$142) if ordered and paid for by November 7. It is important that you order by November 7, as exams that are ordered late between November 15 and March 13 incur an extra \$40 late fee (\$94+\$40 fee). The ordering deadline for second semester only courses will be March 13, 2020.

Glenbard South is committed to ALL students and we want to provide many opportunities for academic support for our students. These are a few of the supports to take advantage of right away at the start of the school year. We are here to help you!

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Math Lab: The Math Lab provides tutoring support to students to help them better understand homework assignments and how to prepare for examinations. Students can also use the Math Lab for help with skill deficits or to make corrections on work.

Writing Center: Writing Center South is located in the LRC. It is open daily during lunch periods to assist students with any writing assignment at any point in the writing process. Students can make an appointment through our Schoology page, <u>Writing Center South</u>, or walk in. They are encouraged to use Google docs to share their work ahead of time and may also receive assistance using Google docs if time does not permit a face-to-face meeting.

Academic Resource Center: Students are able to use their study hall time to receive academic support and address key needs such as targeted skill support and follow through on missed assignments. Teacher assistance is available in the Library Resource Room. Students are placed in Study Hall Resource as a result of failing grades.

AP Cafe: The Advanced Placement (AP) Café/Student Center is open to all students enrolled in an AP course. Students looking for help with an Advanced Placement class, interested in forming a study group or just looking for a quiet place to study should visit the AP Café during school hours.

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Major changes are occurring this year with AP. Starting in 2019-20 schools will implement new annual processes and have access to new classroom resources and supports. AP Exams will be ordered in the fall (2019) via a new registration

and ordering system.

Teachers and students will receive free course and exam preparation resources, including question banks, personal progress checks, and performance feedback. To learn more, visit the <u>AP 2019 page</u>. At the beginning of the school year, students will sign in to their college board account. If students do not have an account, they will need to <u>create an account</u>. A join code will be provided to you from your teacher so students can enroll in their class section.

The fee for each AP Exam your student will take this year has not changed from last year and is \$94 (with the exception of AP Seminar and AP Research which cost \$142) if ordered and paid for by November 7. It is important that you order by November 7, as exams that are ordered late between November 15 and March 13 incur an extra \$40 late fee (\$94+\$40 fee). The ordering deadline for second semester only courses will be March 13, 2020.



August 5th 10a-2p

August 7th 1-3:30p

This vaccine is required for all 12th graders. Any student age 16 or over may also

receive the vaccine in preparation for their 12th grade year.

A consent signed by a parent or guardian is REQUIRED (see attached)

Just some basic information about the clinic:

- They bring all supplies including the vaccine at no cost
- Most insurances cover the vaccine at no charge with the exception of HMO and Medicaid which require patients to go to either their doctor or a walk in clinic
- All patients receiving a vaccine receive a 10% off grocery coupon good at any Jewel Osco store
- Jewel Osco Pharmacy provides documentation of the vaccine for the school file and communicates vaccine status to the student's Primary Care Physician
