PSAT/NMSQT

Glenbard South will offer the opportunity for interested Juniors to take the PSAT/NMSQT at South on **Saturday**, **October 19**, **2019**. Students should register to take the exam on Total Registration. Students must register by September 16th. Cost for the exam is \$20. There will be no late registration. Students can learn more about this exam by visiting the College Board website to decide if you would like to take the PSAT/NMSQT this fall. All juniors will be taking the official SAT on April 14th, 2020 at Glenbard South.

Advanced Placement Courses

Major changes are occurring this year with AP. Starting in 2019-20 schools will implement new annual processes and have access to new classroom resources and supports. AP Exams will be ordered in the fall (2019) via a new registration and ordering system.

The fee for each AP Exam your student will take this year has not changed from last year and is \$94 if ordered and paid for **by November 7**. It is important that you order by November 7, as exams that are ordered late between November 15 and March 13 incur an extra \$40 late fee (\$94+\$40 fee). The ordering deadline for second semester only courses will be March 13, 2020. Students will be committing to take the exam during their AP classes during the week of October 7-11th through the College Board website. Payment will be handled through Total Registration and must be paid by November 7th to avoid late fees.

Homecoming Dance Reminders


Date: The 2019 Homecoming Dance is on Saturday evening, 9/28/19.

Tickets: Tickets will be sold in the Raider Hub before and after school, and during lunch periods, the week of 9/16/19 through Friday, 9/27/19. The price is \$30/ticket. Tickets will also be sold at the door, for Glenbard South students only, at a price of \$35/ticket.

Guest Pass: A Guest Pass for the Homecoming Dance must be completed prior to purchasing the ticket. Guests must be under 21 years old and have either a current high school ID or driver's license. The completed "Guest Pass" should be turned in to the Student Services office.

Students must arrive within 30 minutes of the start of the dance and can depart within the 30 minutes of the conclusion of the dance. (7:00pm-10:00pm)


