

South Boosters Weinstein Award recipients to be honored

Jude Locke and Carrie Shiring are the recipients of the 2019 Glenbard South Boosters Jerry Weinstein Memorial Award for service. The award is presented to individuals who exemplify commitment, dedication and extraordinary achievement in support of Glenbard South's students and community as demonstrated by the late Jerry Weinstein, Glenbard South's first Boosters president. Glenbard South Principal Sandra Coughlin will present the award at halftime of South's varsity home football game on Sept. 13 during Raider Pride Night. Locke and Shiring also will be honored with inscriptions on a plaque at Glenbard South.

"I feel it is a parent's responsibility to volunteer and support the schools and that is what I did," Locke said about her service to Boosters.

Locke attended all of the Boosters meetings from 2008 to 2014 and served as secretary and co-president of the organization. She volunteered for a number of events throughout the six years her daughters were enrolled at Glenbard South and before that during their time at Arbor View Elementary and Glen Crest Middle School. Locke "did whatever was needed at the time to help the school and move (Glenbard South) forward as best I could. We all worked for a common good and I was simply a part of that team."

Shiring's contributions to Boosters included newsletter mailings (2006-08), vice president of volunteers and Booster barbeque chair (2013-14) and general concessions coordinator (2014-15.)

"Boosters make Glenbard South a community," Shiring said. "Boosters allows parents to get to know one another, financially support our school, and celebrate our students. PSAT/NMSQT: OCTOBER 19TH

Registration for the optional Junior PSAT/NMSQT exam is now closed. If you are registered for the exam, you should plan to arrive at Glenbard South High School by 7:30 am for check in and should be dismissed from testing around 11:30 am. Students should enter through Door 4 and report to the Library for testing.

8th grade students at Glen Crest Middle School and Glenn Westlake Middle School: PSAT 8/9

Students will be taking the PSAT 8/9 exam at their middle school for 9th grade placement purposes on October 19th. Look for communication from the middle school Administration for more information on this exam. This is an important experience for all 8th graders. Please make every reasonable effort to be present for this exam.

Highlight of our new course: Project Lead the Way - Introduction to Engineering Design

Introduction to Engineering Design (IED) is a high school level foundation course in the Project Lead The Way Engineering program. In IED students are introduced to the engineering design process. Students will progress from completing structured activities to solving open-ended projects and problems that require them to develop planning, documentation, communication, and other professional skills. Academic Intervention

Academic Intervention Update

We recognize that throughout the school year, a student might need different levels of academic support, depending on a variety of circumstances such as a challenging unit within a course, a difficult assignment, organizational skills, or developing a particular skill such as writing or test-prep. Listed below are several different academic interventions/supports available to our students throughout the school day.

Academic Support is a targeted, three week intervention, assigned to students when they are failing one or more classes and they have a study hall in their schedule. During the three week cycle students report to the Academic Support area, located in the LRC, up to four times a week during their study

hall. Students work with different teachers in one-to-one or small group setting to help improve his/her grade(s). Students that are assigned Academic Support will have their grades reviewed at the end of each three week cycle to either continue or to be placed back into the study hall.

Lunch Intervention is a program designed for freshmen and sophomores who are struggling academically. Students are expected to attend 2-3 times per week during the first half of their lunch period. This intervention is also located in the Academic Resource Area of the LRC. Although this intervention is only 24 minutes in length, students can impact their grades as they use this time to set weekly goals and work on specific skills such as organization and communication.

Students may also access other academic supports in the building to help improve their grades: the math lab, the writing center, their teacher's resource period, or the AP Cafe are all available to assist stu






FRESHMEN ONLY

Melissa is also a school counselor at Child's Voice - a private special education school for children with hearing loss. Melissa graduated from Cornerstone University

with a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education. She spent seven years in the non-profit sector working with children and youth when she decided to get her Master's Degree in School Counseling from Lewis University. Currently, Melissa lives in the Wheaton area with her husband and three children.

Melissa will be in the office one day a week focusing her full attention on our First Generation College bound students. As a first-gen student herself, Melissa knows the value of gaining access to support and resources to help navigate the college and career process. Melissa will spend her time implementing a developmental, preventative, and comprehensive program designed to meet the unique needs of our first-gen students. Specifically, Melissa will be focusing on the freshman and sophomore classes this year. Students will meet with Melissa individually to discuss their post-secondary plans, attend a college fair, meet in small groups to explore college and career-related topics, visit a college campus, and hear about scholarships, financial aid and college options from our ISAC representative.

Juniors and Seniors! Take advantage of meeting with college reps! Now that college visit season has started, we reminded students of our expectations when scheduling visits to meet with college reps. Class time is always the students' priority, so we asked our juniors and seniors to please be mindful of the following:

Maximum of 5 college visits (one per day) during class time Unlimited visits allowed during lunch and study hall time Must be passing the class you are missing to attend the college visit Counselor approval is needed for any additional visits

October highlights for seniors from the Senior College Calendar: Attend FAFSA Completion workshop at Glenbard South October 17, 2019 from 5-7pm with ISAC rep and counselors.

Submit FAFSA directly to Federal Student Aid Programs as soon after October 1_{st} as possible. You will apply online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Complete all Early Admission applications that are due November 1st and request transcripts by mid-October.

Remember that you must leave AT LEAST 10 SCHOOL DAYS for your transcript to be sent.

Continue to search for scholarships and visit colleges – Columbus Day weekend is a great weekend to visit colleges.

Attend College of DuPage College Fair in October (refer to COD website for date and time)

Make note of early priority deadlines for some universities, such as Illinois State University, which has a priority deadline of November 1_{st} which requires everything to be submitted two weeks ahead of time.

Recently, we launched our Profile of a Graduate – a multifaceted transformative movement that underscores six competencies that we want every graduate to embody. Our Profile of a Graduate includes the following competencies:

> A Glenbard Graduate: Collaborates Communicates Thinks Critically

Embraces Diversity Creates Is Self-Empowered

Each of the six competencies is accompanied by descriptions of that particular attribute. The descriptions were developed by department chairs from each of our schools, along with school and district administrators. We worked through several iterations and used resources from EdLeader21, a national network of educators implementing competencies into their systems.

Let's look at the descriptions that accompany communicates: Demonstrates and works to develop an understanding of audience and self Adapts message, style and tone to the chosen medium, audience, and purpose Utilizes clear, concise, and effective oral and written communication Listens actively and responds with empathy and respect Initiates and sustains meaningful conversation in a variety of settings

Here are a few examples of what communication looks like in the classroom: High-level questioning and discussion

> Debate activity Interviews & introductions Presentations Research projects Video production, blogs and podcasts Literature reviews

Good communication skills are essential in all areas of life – personal and professional. Communication is more than speaking and writing; active listening, interpreting visuals and understanding nonverbal cues also are key communication skills.

You likely hear educators say we are preparing students for jobs that don't exist yet. No matter what our students do after high school, we are equipping them with the communication skills they need to be successful. As we move forward with our Profile of a Graduate, we are defining a greater purpose in curriculum and assessment outcomes and refining competency descriptors by subject area.
