Illinois Science Assessment

In compliance with federal testing requirements, Illinois will administer a science assessment to students enrolled in a public school district in grades 5, 8 and 11. The assessment will be administered in an online format and is aligned to the Illinois Learning

Standards for Science incorporating the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), which were adopted in 2014.

District 87 will be testing all Juniors on Thursday, March 19, 2020, from 7:35 am-10:20 am. All students will test using their iPads. Scores will not appear on students' transcripts or be reported to families. Following the test, Juniors will follow the schedule below.

The school day on **Thursday, March 19 for Freshman, Sophomores, and Seniors will begin at 10:35.** Transportation times will be adjusted for students that take the bus.

College Board Suite of Assessments: PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, & SAT

All juniors in Illinois will take the SAT exam on Tuesday, April 14, 2020. They are automatically registered for this test and must take it on this day as a graduation requirement. All Freshmen will take the PSAT 8/9, and all Sophomores will take the PSAT 10 on April 15th. Seniors will not be in attendance on April 14th or 15th and should plan to schedule visits to colleges if they are still deciding on their post-secondary institution. Seniors attending College of DuPage should plan on taking placement testing or meeting with a C.O.D. counselor on these dates.

D87 FREE SAT PREP COURSE: The SAT Prep Course began on January 28th. It will run weekly from January 28 - April 9, 2020. There are two different times offered in this program - *Tuesday from 2:45 p.m. - 5:30 p.m.* or *Tuesday from 5:45 p.m. - 8:30 p.m.* The goal of this program is simple, to help empower students to maximize their SAT Score and enhance their postsecondary opportunities.

Class Registration for the 2020-21 School Year

We will be finishing up with course enrollment meetings and scheduling in the first week of February for the 2020-21 school year. Students are encouraged to challenge themselves appropriately. Check out the Enrollment Handbook on our website to see all of our enriching course offerings across nine departments. Glenbard 87 aims to have all students take at least one Advanced Placement

class over the course of their four years. Advanced Placement courses expose students to the challenge and rigor of a college-level course while still in the high school setting with appropriate supports from teachers and other resources, like our AP Cafe. Talk to your counselor about which AP course is right for you.

Glenbard District 87 is committed to graduating students who embody the competencies of the Glenbard Profile of a Graduate:

Computer Science Discoveries class uses drones to problem solve. Using Java Script code students were challenged to make their way through a Gallery of drone flights. Each flight had to be coded individually by the student and tested. Once they completed all of the tasks they created small Book Creators which allowed them to explain their overall experience with each challenge. This class is entry level class to begin exploring Computer Science. Students may also take AP Computer Science Principles and/or AP Computer Science A. 
Enrollment Season is Upon Us!

The process can be overwhelming, but having a chance to get on campus and ask as many questions as possible can be extremely helpful. College admission counselors are ready and eager to answer whatever questions students and parents have. Provides motivation. Like all goals, having a vision of college keeps students motivated. Sets a vision for the future. Seeing a college in person and becoming aware of all the exciting possibilities of their future puts a concept that might once have been black and white into color. This vision can help students to remember why every test, every assignment, and all their




AFRICAN AMERICAN MALE SUMMIT





Next Year's PE Waiver Policy Continues the Same as This Year

Band students will continue to have two options for a PE Waiver going forward. Under option number one, band students can be able to waive their PE class during first semester in order to take an additional one-semester course. This could be a real benefit to students who are looking to take care of a

graduation requirement (Speech, Consumer, Government!) or enroll in an elective course in another area of interest (Art, Business, Ind. Tech, FACS, Choir, etc.). The second option enables students to take a "temporary" PE waiver, giving them a study hall only during the marching band season so that they can keep up with their work. The marching band season is approximately the first half of the first semester (until the football team is eliminated from the playoffs). In the past few newsletters, I've shared with you information about our Profile of a Graduate, which features six competencies we want every graduate to embody:

Today, let's look at the competency of creates. We want our students to have opportunities to create in the traditional sense – music, writing and art. We also want them to have the chance to create podcasts and videos, as well as create solutions to real problems in the world. We want to empower them to generate original ideas, solutions and products.

Classroom Example

As an example of what this competency looks like in the classroom, sophomores learning about satire in an English class created commercials and public service announcements. They used green screen, Filmmaker Pro, teleprompter app, Schoology and their knowledge of satirical devices to create a product that required them to assess, evaluate and portray characters from a text they read.

Competency Descriptions

The competencies in our Profile of a Graduate are accompanied by descriptions that were developed by department chairs from each of our schools, along with school and district administrators. We worked through several iterations and used resources from EdLeader21, a national network of educators implementing competencies into their systems.
