Principal's Message



Welcome, South Raiders!

It's hard to believe the start of the 2020-21 school year begins next week, August 17. It certainly wasn't our desire to start in a Remote Learning environment, but that's what we will do in order to be prepared and keep everyone safe. Dr. Larson's explanation for why District 87 made the decision to start in a Remote Learning environment was based on these reasons:

Strict guidance from the Government and Health agencies Supply chain issues with personal protective equipment (PPE) acquisition Facilities planning and changes Staff availability

I have pulled out key information from our Parent <u>FAQ</u> to share.

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Monday/Tuesday/Friday 1:00-2:25: Students participate in additional learning activities via Schoology, attend teacher office hours, complete homework as assigned.

Zero hour does not meet at a specific time and these courses have learning activities available via Schoology.

Schedule: Students will receive teacher-led instruction at home via live stream. They will keep their full schedule of classes participating in the same classes, with the same teachers. Students will access all assignments, assessments, and learning activities in Schoology. Teachers are always available for help via Gmail, Schoology, or online office hours.

Grading: Last year, when we went into remote learning, ISBE issued a directive requiring that grades "do no harm" to students to accommodate the vastly different physical, mental, economic, technological, and social-emotional experiences of students, most of whom were engaging in remote school day learning for the first time.

ISBE has lifted that requirement for the 2020-21 school year. This means a return to traditional grades (1, 2, 3, 4, 5) for completion of assignments, assessments, other classroom instructional activities, finals and the semester grade. Students' grades will count and may fluctuate up and down throughout the semester as they learn new skills and concepts. Final grades will be factored into student transcripts and reflected within GPA.

Attendance:

Students are expected to attend class each period. Teachers will take attendance. Students that are absent 3 or more times will be referred to the attendance office and may receive a dean intervention.

Recording lessons:

Classes will not be recorded for future use. We will be streamed in real-time to encourage students to take advantage of the synchronous nature of our revamped learning model, we will not record and post lessons for later viewing. If a student is too ill to participate remotely, students will still have access to Schoology to get the lesson materials from that day. This is exactly the same as the expectations prior to the pandemic.

Classroom Guidelines for Students During Online Learning

Please keep in mind that the classroom expectations are no different than what is expected in a traditional classroom setting. When you are in class in the virtual setting, the expectations are the same as they are in a Glenbard South classroom.

Tips for Success

- Be prepared
 - Know the correct link that you will be using for the class.
 - Know what time the class begins.
 - Have headphones, or eliminate distractions in the room.
 - Find a quiet place to work.
 - Know where to get help.
 - Tech support for students- fill out this FORM
 - DIRECTIONS FOR LOGGING INTO ZOOM CLICK HERE
 - DIRECTIONS FOR LOGGING INTO SCHOOLOGY CLICKHERE
- Learn the virtual classroom that you will be using (Zoom, Google Meet, etc)

- Learn how to enter the class.
- Learn how to leave the class at the end of the lesson.
- Learn how to mute your microphone.
- Learn how to turn off your camera.
- · Remember, this is a classroom
 - Be respectful to your teachers and your peers.
- Limit your internet usage
 - Streaming devices (Netflix, online gaming, wifi, etc) will limit your internet connection.
- Be patient!
 - This is new and challenging for everyone involved

Attendance

- Just like in-person learning, classroom attendance during the remote setting is mandatory.
- Be on time- students who are late to class will be marked tardy by their teacher.
- If you are going to be absent from class, please have your parent/guardian call the attendance office by 10:30 AM.
- Stay in the classroom the entire lesson. If you need to leave for any reason, please notify your teacher without disrupting the lesson, and have your parent/guardian contact the attendance office.
- Be consistent- develop good attendance habits early in the semester.

Behavior

- Remember, if it is not appropriate in the classroom, it is not appropriate virtually.
- You are not permitted to record class at any time.
- Dress appropriately.
- Set up an appropriate background setting. You may set up an appropriate virtual background.
- Always use appropriate language when you are speaking or writing in the chatbox. Remember, anything that you type in the chat can be viewed by your classmates and your teacher.
- Do not disrupt the learning environment.

20-21 School Year Testing Announcements:

College Board Testing Information: SAT, PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10 & PSAT 8/9

Seniors: You were scheduled to take the SAT in April, but due to cessation of inperson instruction, this test was cancelled. Illinois has funded a fall SAT administration for all seniors, and it is believed that this will be administered on Wednesday, September 23, if we are able to resume in-person instruction. Please be aware that Illinois is still requiring all seniors to take a School Day SAT for graduation and this will fulfill this requirement. Parents wishing to opt out their 12 grade student from SAT testing on September 23rd due to Covid-19 safety concerns, should call Ms. Jessica Santee, Assistant Principal for Instruction at 630-942-6800.

Juniors: You are encouraged to take the **PSAT 10/NMSQT** (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) on **Saturday**, **October 17**. This exam serves several purposes:

It provides you with a good practice opportunity for the SAT which you will take on Wednesday, April 13 with your grade level to fulfill your Illinois state graduation requirement.

It allows you to enroll in the **National Merit Scholarship Competition**. This is the qualifying exam.

More information about registration will come soon. Juniors will be offered an opportunity to take an SAT Prep Class offered at each high school during 2nd semester.

Sophomores: All sophomores will take the PSAT 10 on Tuesday, April 14. This will allow for continued feedback on learning standards and progress as you prepare for the SAT junior year.

Freshman: All freshmen will take the PSAT 8/9 exam on Tuesday, April 14. This is the same exam used for student placement in 8th grade, and allows students/parents feedback relative student learning and preparation for the SAT junior year.


Test preparation: Juniors will be offered an opportunity to take an SAT Prep Class offered at each high school during 2nd semester. All students can prepare for the PSAT or SAT test is through FREE individualized test preparation at the Khan Academy website (www.khanacademy.org/test-prep). Junior students will learn about this free offering at school. Parents and students can learn more about this free resource by watching a 10 minute video at https://goo.gl/BjYDZg. College Board Account: All Sophomores-Seniors should have a College Board Account. This account allows students to enroll in their AP Class and register to take AP exams, view scores and track progress on the PSAT and SAT, send scores to colleges and universities. Directions on setting up individual college board accounts can be found here: Setting Up Your College Board Account Link

Advanced Placement: District #87 will pay the exam fees for one AP test for every

student enrolled in AP Courses this year. All additional Advanced Placement Exam fees will be included in student registration this year. Students will register for their AP class/exam during the first two weeks of the school year using their College Board Account.

What a challenging year. Thank you for your support as we prepare for this year's unique kickoff to the school year. Even in these difficult times, we are confident your student will have a quality, rigorous experience. The following is important information to be aware of regarding the first day of school.

READY FOR THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL- for students and parents

School starts at 7:30AM on Monday, August 17, and all

students are learning remotely until September 8. Students should log into Schoology on their Glenbard iPad before 7:30AM. Then, open your first period class and tap the link to the livestream video. If you do not see a link to the livestream, email your teacher.

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Things to do before school starts:

Make sure your iPad is fully charged and connected to WiFi.

Make sure you know how to log into Schoology (with your Glenbard Google credentials) on your iPad.

Many teachers will use Zoom for live streaming. Follow these directions to access the Zoom app on your iPad.

New students should complete the Welcome to the iPad course before school starts on Monday.

Students with technical difficulties may submit a technical help request online or call the technical support phone line at 630-942-7777. Then leave a message with your first and last name, school, ID number, call back phone number and a description of the issues. A tech support person will call you back during school hours. This is available in English and Spanish.
