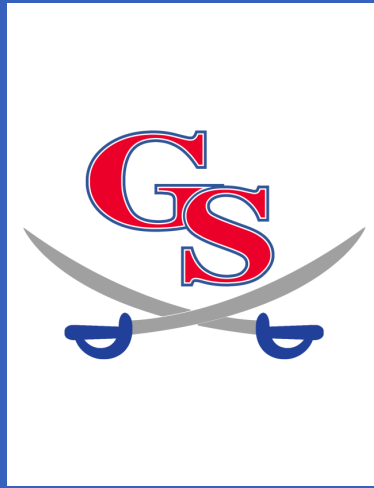

We have adjusted the schedule next week so that all classes meet. Please make a note of the following:

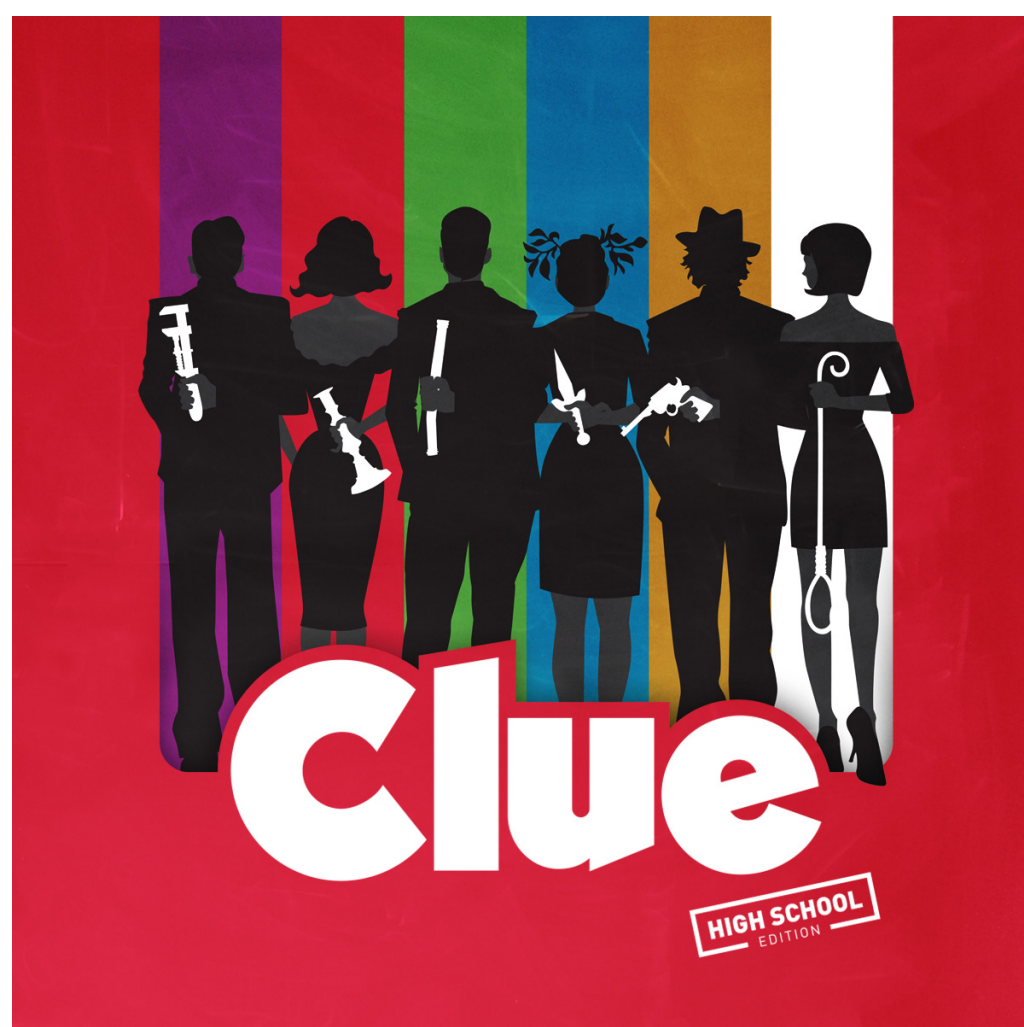

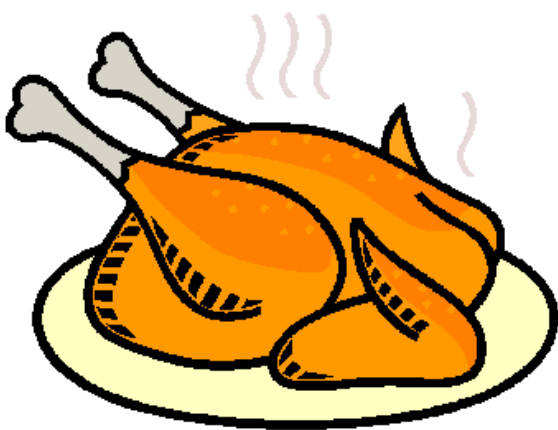

Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors

Lifetouch has provided an additional opportunity for yearbook photos on Monday, November 30th from 3:00pm to 7:00pm. Students are required to sign-up in advance for a time slot. Time slots have been set up specifically to ensure only a determined number of students are in the building per slot. In order to sign-up for your time slot, please click on the [Sign-up Genius Link here](#).

Students should enter through Main Entrance (Door #4). Students will proceed through the thermal scanner to verify they are fever-free.

Only students will be allowed to enter the building.

INSTRUCTIONAL INSIDER Adjusted Final Exam Week

Final Exam Adjustment

Due to our rapidly evolving circumstances during this pandemic, we have had to adjust instruction to better meet the needs of our students. Teachers across the district have been given the autonomy to make those instructional decisions, which may look different from course to course. This requires us to also be adaptive on how we assess student learning.

The end of the semester is usually reserved for Final Exam days and the schedule adjusted accordingly. However, the instructional adjustments teachers made this semester have resulted in the need to adapt these assessments as well. As a result, Glenbard District 87 will not have a traditional final exam schedule. Instead we will follow the schedule below, and your student may encounter a variety of assessment experiences ranging from a final exam, a unit summative assessment or a culminating project. Teachers will communicate how first semester grades will be finalized.

We are very proud of our students and how they rose up to the learning challenges this semester. If you or your student have any questions, feel free to reach out to your student's teachers.

2021 Standardized School Day Testing Information

2021 Standardized School Day Testing Information

Over the next few weeks, counselors will communicate with students to discuss the benefits of taking challenging yet balanced courses to ensure their academic path prepares them for life after high school. As part of this

preparation, students will begin to prepare to take standardized tests that may help them gauge their readiness.

College Board Suite of Assessments

For many years, the State of Illinois has funded a college entrance exam for juniors. A few years ago, the State decided to shift from the ACT Exam to the SAT Exam. **All juniors in Illinois will take the SAT exam on Tuesday, April 13, 2021.** This is not an optional exam; in fact, the state is now requiring a school day administration of the SAT for graduation from any Illinois High School. Please be assured that most, if not all, colleges accept either an ACT or an SAT score for acceptance decisions.

- If students want to improve their scores on the school day administration of the SAT, Glenbard West is tentatively scheduled to host an SAT National Test date on March 13th. Interested students should register through their College Board accounts by February 12th.
- Seniors attending College of DuPage should plan on taking placement testing or meeting with a C.O.D. counselor on dates they do not have class.

[Glenbard South is offering a FREE 10-week SAT Prep Course taught by Academic Approach SAT Instructors from January 25 - April 8, 2020 for Juniors.](#) There are two different times to choose to ensure every Junior has the opportunity to participate in this program, Thursday from 2:45 p.m. - 5:30 p.m. or from 5:45 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. The goal of this program is simple, to help empower students to maximize their SAT Score and enhance their postsecondary opportunities. As testing scores become available throughout the year, students may access their scores in their very own College Board portal. Click the link for [Student Directions to Access Scores in the College Board Reporting Portal.](#)

One of the key advantages of the Suite of Assessments that excites us is the availability for students to receive free, high-quality exam preparation through Khan Academy online. Students are able to take practice tests, receive immediate feedback, and store and retrieve previous exam scores that they have taken to track their progress. This may be especially helpful for those juniors who took the PSAT/NMSQT exam in October, as it will give a benchmark that Khan Academy will use to customize SAT prep for the student. Some parents may still choose to have their students take one or more ACT exams during the spring. These are offered on specific Saturdays nationwide. To register for one of these exam dates, visit <https://www.act.org/content/act/en/students-and-parents.html>.

Counselor Corner

Attention Freshmen!

Counselors have been working with freshmen students during Freshman Focus time to introduce Naviance and explore career clusters. [Click here](#) to see an electronic brochure that describes all of the cool tools Naviance has to offer. Students were asked to complete a Career Cluster Inventory and counselors paid particular attention to discussing with students how to line up career clusters course choices for sophomore year. On November 18th, counselors showed students how to create a four year plan at home with their families and reviewed Glenbard South graduation requirements. On December 2nd, counselors will be going over the enrollment process for sophomore year courses! Please encourage your freshman to attend!!

Enrollment Information For Next Year

Freshman, Sophomores and Juniors will receive enrollment packets with instructions after Thanksgiving break. Packets will be mailed home, including their individualized enrollment form filled in with teacher recommendations.

- On December 2nd, counselors will meet with freshmen during Freshman Focus to review the enrollment process.
- Enrollment forms require parent signature. These enrollment forms should be completed and a screenshot of the form should be emailed to your student's counselor.
- The official course selection will actually occur in the electronic PowerSchool portal. Instructions to enroll in the Powerschool portal will be included in the packet mailed home, in addition to a link for a screencast guiding you through the Powerschool Portal to choose your student's classes for next year.
- The Powerschool Portal opens on December 7th and will remain open until January 4th. This time window will allow students and families time to review these course selections over winter break.
- It is important to note that our course offerings are driven by your careful consideration of course selection. Counselors will partner with core classes and meet one-on-one with each student after winter break to review their selections and are able to make corrections or changes at that time.
- Our Enrollment Handbook is updated every year and is available on our school website under the Student tab. When choosing your student's electives, please pay careful attention to our district graduation requirements. It is also important to make note of admission requirements to your student's first choice of a post secondary institution.

Thank you for your support during this enrollment process. Please feel free to contact your student's school counselor with any questions.

Technical Center of DuPage

FAFSA required for Seniors

A non-academic graduation requirement for seniors this year is that you either need to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), or the Alternate Application for Illinois Financial Aid, or to submit a FAFSA Opt-Out Form to your counselor.

FAFSA opened up on October 1st! Our ISAC representative, Ms. Yanika Barfield, can help you file your FAFSA. She has weekly virtual office hours every Thursday. Please contact Mrs. Duffy at 630-942-6648 or michelle_duffy@glenbard.org to schedule a Google Meet appointment with Ms. Barfield.

First-Generation News

This fall, counselors hosted different virtual events that focused on our first-generation seniors. Students learned about [local colleges and the first-generation programs](#) provided on their campuses. We also reviewed the college application process including how to use Naviance to request application materials such as transcripts and letters of recommendation. Later in the month, students had the opportunity to complete a College of DuPage application with the support of Ms. Loconsole, our COD admissions counselor.


First-generation seniors and their parents attended a FAFSA completion workshop supported by several Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC) representatives who are experts in completing the FAFSA. On a separate evening, we also presented to parents and students on general [financial aid and scholarship information](#). [College Greenlight](#) was highlighted as an excellent scholarship resource for first-generation students. Additionally,

students were informed that the Glenbard South Local Scholarship application will become available shortly before winter break.

On December 1st at 1:30 pm, we will be hosting a zoom session with juniors who are first-generation to explore and identify career goals. Course enrollment is right around the corner and we want students to choose classes that align with their career interests. In the spring, juniors will be exploring options after high school such as college, trades, military or the workforce and having a career goal drives these decisions. An email will be sent with more information on how to access this session.
