Principal's Message



Dear Glenbard South Families:

At the end of a calendar year, it is typical to be reflective and appreciative. I think it's particularly appropriate this year.

As 2020 comes to a close, I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the struggles that have been a part of our community and our world. The term "unprecedented" might seem overused, but it does state the obvious. The reality is that families have experienced dramatic changes that have impacted their finances, health, safety, and emotional well-being of loved ones. Glenbard South has been responsive and supportive through personal connections, academic, social-emotional supports, and financial assistance.

We also know that education has been turned inside-out and upside-down and students have been affected. I am proud of our students in all that they've accomplished this semester. I want to commend and thank our Glenbard South staff for their ability to be

adaptive and creative with their curriculum and instruction. Even with their own family challenges and sacrifices, our entire staff, including secretaries, assistants, maintenance, security and food service has done their very best to make our building safe, clean, and welcoming.

Notables:

- Equity work is of major importance. We are creating a student equity group that will work with personnel to gather input in making Glenbard South an inclusive environment.
- The semester started with a commitment to ensure that Glenbard South is a safe supportive community. Our first webinar on Sexual Violence Education aired on Dec. 9th. We will continue to educate our students and staff about healthy relationships and how to seek resources.

Special Announcements

This week the district announced we will return to *In-person Hybrid* learning on January 19, 2021. Parents should go to <u>PowerSchool</u> to make a selection for either fully remote or in-person hybrid.

Additionally, Glenbard District 87 contracted with SafeGuard Surveillance, LLC. to provide weekly COVID-19 saliva screening to students and staff. The primary goal is to allow for more consistent in-person instruction by assessing the risks of returning to our hybrid model and lessening community spread. It is important to know that students attending hybrid instruction or coming on campus for extracurricular activities and athletics must agree to the COVID-19 Student Consent and Waiver in PowerSchool. The deadline is Dec. 22nd. Further details can be found here. An informational video will be provided in early January.

Enrollment process is happening now

Enrollment process is happening now: Consider challenging yourself with an Advanced Placement course during the 2021-22 school year

Thank you to all of you who were able to attend our **AP Informational Sessions on December 2nd and 3rd**. You can watch the <u>evening</u> and <u>afternoon</u> sessions if you were unable to attend.

Here are some important takeaways from the information sessions:

- Advanced Placement courses allow students to take a college-level course with the support of a high school system.
- Students take an AP exam in May and depending on their score, can earn college credit for the course. The amount and type of credit is determined by the college or university.
- We have 18 Advanced Placement courses that range from 9-12th grade courses.
- Both teachers and students shared how the environment of the AP classes are rich with curiosity and teamwork, and the experience itself makes it worth it.
- Both teachers and students shared how there are **many supports available**, both by the teacher and classmates, as well as around the building to make sure students don't fall through the cracks and can be successful in these classes.
- College Admission officers shared they are looking to admit students who have challenged themselves and have taken a rigorous schedule.
- Parents and students shared how AP courses help build resilience,
 independence and give students an incredible sense of accomplishment by the end of the year.


SAT PREP

Scholarship Information

The Glenbard South Local Application is live in Naviance now and will close on January 29, 2021. This one application is used to qualify students for a number of local scholarships that are designated for Glenbard South students only. An email was sent to all seniors and parents with instructions for this scholarship. Seniors: It is not too late to apply for college!! Many deadlines are between January 1st and February 1st. Here are a couple documents that address some college questions for you:

This first document is a timeline that breaks down some of the first steps you must take when completing your college applications. It would be best if you START with this document.

This second document is a checklist with some tutorials built in.

You do NOT need an appointment with your counselor to request a transcript, but remember to allow your counselor 10 days to process your request. That means you can't wait until the night before the application deadline to request a transcript. The second document listed above has a tutorial on how to request the transcript in Naviance. Make sure it is only INITIAL transcript that is requested.

North Central - rolling admission

Purdue - January 15 regular decision

UIC - February 1 regular decision

Mental Health Support for the Holiday Break

Raider Parents/Guardians-

2020 has been a tough year for everyone. Mental health ebbs and flows depending on the season, situation, and circumstances. There is no doubt that depression and anxiety are on the raise this year, especially in teenagers.

Caregivers, listed are some signs to look out for that may indicate your student is experiencing anxiety and/or depression:

- Displays of sadness or hopelessness
- · Irritability, anger, or hostility
- Tearfulness or frequent crying
- Withdrawal from family and friends
- Loss of interest in activities
- Poor School Performance or Lack of Engagement
- Changes in eating and sleeping habits
- Restlessness and agitation
- Feelings of Worthlessness and Guilt
- · Lack of enthusiasm and motivation
- Fatigue or lack of energy
- Difficulty Concentrating
- Unexplained aches and pains (somatic complaints)
- Thoughts/mentions of death or suicide
- Incidences of self-injury

We want our Raider students and families to remember: **YOU ARE NOT ALONE!** It is **OK** to *not* be **OK**.

It is not OK to suffer silently.

It is not OK to feel unsafe.

It is OK to ask for help if you need it.

If you or someone you know is:

- · a danger to him/herself, having thoughts of wanting life to end
- a danger to others
- being hurt by someone, stuck in an abusive or neglectful situation

We want our students and families to know that there are a number of supportive resources that can be accessed in the community over the holiday break. <u>You are not alone.</u>






