- **GBS STUDENTS**: Any student is welcome to attend a session during PLC time on **December 5th**.


There will also be a district-wide webinar available to the entire community on December 7th at 7 pm. All of these sessions will cover the same information for our stakeholders.



FREE SAT PREP for Glenbard Juniors

All Juniors at Glenbard South will take the School-day SAT on April 12, 2023. To help all students achieve their full potential, District 87 is offering a free SAT Prep course for all Glenbard Juniors. Scoring well on the SAT affords students with multiple post-secondary opportunities, including scholarships and admission to competitive colleges and universities.

The SAT Prep course is provided by Academic Approach, a leading test preparation provider. Participating students average a 90-100 point overall gain on their score. The class will run for 10 weeks. Students can choose in-person or fully virtual format.

A diagnostic test will be given after school on January 5, 2023. Classes will begin the week of January 23, 2023. In-person classes will meet on Tuesdays, 2:45 - 5:30pm. Virtual classes will meet on Tuesdays, 5:45 - 8:30pm.

Parent Meetings with Juniors and Counselors

Parents of juniors recently received a letter inviting them to meet with their student's school counselor. These *optional* meetings will focus on reviewing transcripts, checking credits and graduation requirements, discussing SAT testing, and post-secondary plans for your junior. She will be scheduling 30 minute appointments through November during regular school hours. These meetings will be conducted in person, or via Zoom or Google meets with the student in our office.

Larson encourages students to explore dual credit course options

We have a long tradition of creating opportunity, access and a sense of belonging for students to experience early college coursework through Advanced Placement and dual credit classes.

Our strong partnership with the College of DuPage (C.O.D.) allows our students to take dual credit courses, taught by Glenbard teachers during the regular school day. These courses provide our students with the opportunity to earn three college credit hours per course at no cost to students or families.

Dual credit courses have many benefits for our students and families, including:

- Reduced college costs
- Expedited time to degree completion
- Easing the transition between high school and college
- Opportunities for improving degree attainment.

I encourage you and your student to contact your school counselor to explore opportunities to enroll in a dual credit class.

We envision our dual credit offerings in two important categories: college general education

opportunities for students to get a head start on college general education requirements.

- 1. English 1101: English Composition 1 (IAI C1 900)
- 2. English 1102: English Composition 2 (IAI C1 901R)
- 3. Speech 1101: Fundamentals of Speech Communications (IAI C2 900)
- 4. Math 1218: General Education Math (IAI M1 904)

Each of these courses is part of the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI), which means they are widely transferable for college credit among more than 100 participating colleges and universities in Illinois and beyond. I encourage students to talk with their counselor to see which dual credit options would be best for them.

In October, the Board of Education approved adding four capstone dual credit course experiences for our students. These courses allow students to dive deeply into a specific area that aligns with their postsecondary interests and earn college credit at the same time. These capstone courses will allow students to explore the fields of education and horticulture:

- 1. Intro to Education: Dual Credit 1100
- 2. School Procedures: Dual Credit 1101
- 3. Intro to Horticulture: Dual Credit 1100
- 4. Intro to Sustainable Urban Agriculture: Dual Credit 2300

I continue to be impressed with the students who have enrolled in dual credit classes, and I look forward to more students taking this opportunity to earn early college credit. We are committed to preparing students for success by exposing them to college-level coursework. I encourage you and your student to connect with your school counselor to discuss opportunities to enroll in a dual credit class.
