From the office of the Principal

Good afternoon, Raiders,

I hope the school year is off to a great start for you. All of our classes are getting into their stride and students are hard at work. As I stop into classes, it is great to see our students discussing, reading, working collaboratively, cooking, conducting lab experiments, designing with graphics, speaking French or Spanish to peers and so much more. The energy is palpable in the halls, classrooms, courts and fields.



We held a successful Activity and Athletic Fair in our gym during all lunch periods on August 23rd. Students were able to talk to other student leaders, sponsors and coaches and sign up to get involved. The fall athletic season is off to a great start for all of the teams, with several of the programs significantly growing in participation rates. Thank you to all of those who organized and participated in this important event.

We are also a few weeks into our inaugural school year of our new schedule. We have had five advisory sessions and tomorrow will be our first agency session. Students signed up for their choice of teacher session on Friday through our new app during advisory. We are working through some issues with our new app, nevertheless 95% of students were signed up for a session by the end of the day on Friday. We will help the few that haven't during 1st and 2nd period classes Monday, before our first Raider Hour Agency day. It is required that students are signed up for and attend that location for every agency date. Learn about our long-range facility plan at community forum

As part of our facility planning process, Glenbard South will host a Facility Planning Community Forum to share information about our district-wide facility needs and development of a new 10-year facility plan to address those needs.

South's Facility Planning Community Forum will be an **open house format from 5:30 to 8 p.m. Sept. 28** at Glenbard South. Please plan to join us.

Glenbard's four high schools, which range in age from 50 to 100 years old, continue to have numerous capital improvement needs. We are excited about developing a new 10-year facility plan. The plan will consider instructional best practice, safety and opportunities to connect and collaborate. Additional funding will be necessary to implement the new facility plan.

Development of new 10-year facility plan

- Necessary warm/safe/dry projects (roofs, parking lots, boilers, cooling units, etc.)
- Safety and access upgrades (doors, hardware, entrances, access to administrative offices, etc.)
- · Renovation of science labs and restrooms
- Wold Architects & Engineers and Performance Services, Inc. will maintain community asset.

Funding Sources

- Through **sound fiscal stewardship**, we continue budgeting dollars for the new ten-year master facility plan.
- Alternate revenue source (ARS) bonds will accelerate projects from the 2013 master facility plan, such as renovations to science labs and restrooms.
 - Our ARS bonds are expiring, and we approved issuing a new series of ARS bonds that will total about \$29 million of debt within our operating budgets.
 - Will not increase the district's tax rate
- A referendum is necessary to provide the remaining needed funds.

Key points:

- Facility improvements are necessary to support instructional environments.
- Without a large, one-time revenue source, some improvements are not possible.
- Construction costs will increase, but efficient borrowing yields a high return on investment.
- Instructional spaces demand attention, but lack of funding postpones improvements.
- D87 facilities particularly entrances, cafeterias and collaboration spaces are behind peer districts.
- In 2014, D87 committed to \$100 million over 10 years; however, we exceeded that commitment by spending \$154 million over the past 10 years (\$35 million from 2014 referendum) while maintaining balanced budgets.

Bus Information

Students that are eligible for bus transportation will find their route number as well as pick-up and drop-off information on their schedules. Bus route numbers can also be found on their student ID cards. Students are required to present their student ID to their bus driver upon request. Students should only ride their designated bus. Glenbard South has implemented *FirstView*, a First Student bus tracking and communication app for your smartphone or desktop. *FirstView* will allow our students and families the ability to know where their First Student bus is before school and after school. School Safety

The safety and security of our students and staff are a priority. Glenbard South has a secure entrance to help verify all visitors are properly checked in. We also actively participate in required drills to ensure that students understand their role in the event of an emergency. Our drills are conducted in partnership with the DuPage County Sheriff's Office and the Lisle/Woodridge Fire Department. In addition, all students and staff started the school year with a safety video to review our lockdown and evacuation procedures. Thank you to all of our Raider families who were able to join us for **Raider Open House on 8/31/23**. Many families joined us for an optional session on the **P/SAT Suite of Assessments, Dual Credit, and AP Classes**. Please see the slides for discussion <u>here</u>, and feel free to reach out to Mr. Byrne with any questions.

Over the summer, we shared information for students logging in to their College Board accounts to get specific information about their latest score on the P/SAT Suite of Assessments. Additionally, we suggested several free resources to support your students as they prepare for their P/SAT exam this year:

1. KHAN ACADEMY

Khan offers a variety of FREE courses in all Subject areas (not JUST Math and Reading/Language Arts!).

- Students can use a Get Ready Course to prepare for a course they are planning to take in the fall.
- Students can review an Academic Course they have already taken, to build up their skills.
- Students can use the SAT Prep Course to prepare for standardized tests this year.

2. More Ideas to Support your Student's EVIDENCE-BASED READING AND WRITING Score

Linda B. Gambrell, Distinguished Professor of Education in the Eugene T. Moore School of Education at Clemson University, and former president of the International Reading Association, points to research suggesting that reading "four to five books during the summer was potentially enough to prevent a decline in reading achievement from spring to fall."

- Our school librarian, Mrs. Mankowski has made more than 1,200 titles available for students on Sora, our school e-reader. Students can continue using Sora for reading throughout the year and request new titles if they don't find one they are looking for. Sora is often used for reading in class but can also be used by students outside of specific coursework. Check out the Glenbard South Library Webpage for specific instructions for using Sora.
- The Glen Ellyn Library (https://gepl.org/) has many great books available.
- The Bookstore of Glen Ellyn has several titles on their Teens/Young Adult Recommendation list: https://bookstoreofge.com/lists/E02SnnrpZ7s.
- Finally, don't forget that all Glenbard South students have digital access to the New York Times. Many students have already activated their accounts; if your student has not yet done so, instructions are available on Schoology and on the Glenbard South Webpage. Reading the paper every day is a great way to build reading skills and stay informed about the world around us.

3. More Ideas to Support your Student's MATH Score

- A simple (and fun) way to incorporate math into everyday lifeis by playing games and cooking/baking with family and friends.
- Yahtzee is a great way to practice mental math.
- Paper or online sudoku or Nerdle are great options to help students work on their problem-solving and logic skills.
- YouCubed (https://www.youcubed.org/resource/parent-resources/): You Cubed is an
 organization whose mission is "to inspire, educate and empower teachers of mathematics,
 transforming the latest research on math learning into accessible and practical forms." There are
 many, many great resources for all learners on the Parent Resources.
- <u>Flipped Math (www.FlippedMath.com</u>): Flipped Math is a free resource, based on the flipped classroom approach; students watch a video and take notes on the math concept seen from that

video. They then practice the concept, followed by an application practice, and end with a mastery check. Courses available: Algebra 1, Algebra 2, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, and Calculus.

All Juniors will be participating in the PSAT/NMSQT exam on Tuesday, October 10th. (PLEASE NOTE: this is the correct date). This will be a non-attendance day for the 9th, 10th, and 12th grade students. Juniors will be registered through the school and do not need to do or pay anything to take the exam. This is an important exam to prepare for the SAT in April.

Parent-teacher conferences will be held on October 25 and 26. Both school days will be early release days for students (1:10 dismissal). On October 25, conferences will be virtual (on Zoom) from 4 - 8 pm. On October 26, conferences will be in person in classrooms, from 2 - 6 pm. Friday, October 27 is a non-attendance day for all students.

Registration for Parent-teacher conferences will be done in Power PTC, which is accessed through PowerSchool. Families will be sent information about specific registration dates as soon as it is available.
