UNDERCLASS AWARDS CEREMONY and SENIOR MEETING

On Friday, April 25 during Raider Hour, we will have our annual Underclass Awards Ceremonies. The purpose of these celebrations is to recognize and acknowledge our students for their commitment to excellence, continuous growth and learning in their classes, and participation in athletics and extracurriculars. This is a great time for each class to celebrate the great work of all members of the class. Details and photos will be shared with families after this event.

AP TESTING DAYS: May 5 - 9 and 12 - 16

Each exam is administered on a different day, based on a schedule set by the College Board. Students registered for the exam in the Fall through AP Classroom. Please see <u>this link</u> for specific dates for each exam.

AP Exams are administered differently depending on the exam mode: Fully Digital, Hybrid Digital, and Paper. Other subjects, such as AP Art and Design or the AP world language and culture exams, also have unique requirements. Each mode is described in more detail below.

Fully Digital AP Exams

For fully digital exams, students complete multiple-choice and free-response questions on their school-issued iPad, using the Bluebook app, with all responses automatically submitted at the end of the exam.

There are 12 fully digital AP Exams given at Glenbard South in 2025:

- AP Comparative Government and Politics
- AP Computer Science A
- AP Computer Science Principles**
- AP English Language and Composition
- AP English Literature and Composition
- AP Environmental Science
- AP European History
- AP Human Geography
- AP Psychology
- AP Seminar**
- AP United States Government and Politics
- AP United States History

**AP Computer Science Principles and AP Seminar students complete an end-of-course exam in Bluebook, and they also submit their performance tasks through the AP Digital Portfolio for scoring.

Hybrid Digital AP Exams

For hybrid digital exams, students complete multiple-choice questions and view free-response questions on their school-issued iPads using the Bluebook app. Students will handwrite their free-

response answers in paper exam booklets that are returned for scoring.

There are 9 hybrid digital AP Exams given at Glenbard South in 2025:

- AP Biology
- AP Calculus AB
- AP Calculus BC
- AP Chemistry
- AP Macroeconomics
- AP Microeconomics
- AP Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism
- AP Physics C: Mechanics
- AP Statistics

Paper AP Exams

The exam delivery and free-response sections for these subjects remain unchanged for the May 2025 AP Exam Administration.

There are 3 paper AP Exams given at Glenbard South in 2025:

- AP French Language and Culture
- AP Spanish Language and Culture
- AP Music Theory

AP Computer Science Principles

AP Computer Science Principles is a fully digital exam. However, students need their printed Personalized Project Reference (PPR) for use on exam day. Students should talk to their AP Computer Science Principles teacher for details.

AP Art and Design Exams

Students submit all work (three portfolio components) for scoring through the AP Digital Portfolio. There is no end-of-course exam. Students should talk to their AP Art and Design teacher for details.

Health

Dental exam forms for 9th grade students are due by May 15, 2025. The exam should take place between November 15, 2023 and May 15, 2025. Please send any completed dental forms to: <u>barbara_smith@glenbard.org</u>

All current 11th graders are required to submit proof of a second dose of Meningococcal ACWY vaccine (Menactra, Menveo, MenQuadfi or Penbraya). This dose must be completed after the student's 16th birthday and prior to 12th grade entry. Students are not considered fully registered for school and are subject to school exclusion until the proof of vaccine is completed. Proof of immunization may be emailed over the summer to: <u>barbara_smith@glenbard.org</u>

All incoming 9th grade students must submit a completed Certificate of Child Health examination form with an immunization record prior to the start of school on August 14, 2025. Students who do not submit this required health record will be subject to exclusion on the first day of school. Please submit the completed Certificate of Child Health exam to: <u>barbara_smith@glenbard.org</u>

Any student that will require medication during the day for the 2025-2026 school year will need to turn in a new medication form completed by a doctor and a parent or guardian. Forms may be accessed here: <u>Medication Form</u>

Any student that will require a Food Allergy Action Plan, Diabetic Care Plan or Asthma Action plan should turn completed forms into the health office during registration in August, along with any medication or supplies needed during the school year.

School Counseling

Seniors: FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

- As a reminder, a non-academic graduation requirement for seniors is that they either need to file the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u> (FAFSA) or complete the **FAFSA Non-Participation Form.** The non-participation digital form is now available <u>here</u>. Please note that if you fill out the Non-participation form, you can change your mind and apply for FAFSA later. Some tips for a successful FAFSA completion:
 - 1. For those of you that have not created a FSA ID, please use <u>this linked document</u> to create it. It is advised that it is created at least 2 days prior to the filing the FAFSA. Both

parents and students need their own FSA ID.

- 2. It is ideal for both students and parents to be in attendance for FAFSA completion.
- 3. Please bring your 2023 tax forms, W-2s, and social security numbers for you and your student.
- 4. Please also have a final list of colleges your senior is applying to.

This is a great opportunity for families to receive assistance with completing the FAFSA. If your student still needs to file, we encourage you to attend.

Senior Exit Meetings

Our school counselors are meeting individually with each senior to review post-secondary plans and conduct exit interviews. We are also assisting students in SchooLinks to ensure their final transcripts are sent to the appropriate college. As seniors make their final college decisions, we are here to support families by comparing award letters and exploring their options during this exciting time.

Additionally, all seniors are required to complete the Senior Graduation Survey in SchooLinks. Some students may be asked to complete it while waiting for their counselor, and our office staff is available to provide assistance as needed. We appreciate your support as we help our seniors take these important next steps!

Parent Guide for College Admissions: Next Steps

As we move further into spring, here are the key priorities for seniors and juniors to keep in mind in the coming months:

Seniors

Finalizing Decisions – With May 1st (National College Decision Day) approaching, your student should be ready to submit their college decision and deposit. If they are still undecided, encourage one last campus visit or a conversation with an admissions representative to help them decide.
 Handling Waitlists – If your student is on a waitlist, they should follow up with the admissions office to express continued interest and provide any updates on achievements or new grades.
 Preparing for the Transition – Once a decision is made, check for important next steps like housing applications, orientation sign-ups, and financial aid paperwork. Encourage your student to explore summer jobs or volunteer opportunities to prepare for their next chapter.

Juniors

✓ College List & Visits – Now is the time to finalize a list of reach, target, and safety schools. If possible, plan campus visits to help your student refine their preferences.

✓ Letters of Recommendation – Encourage your student to ask teachers, coaches, or mentors for recommendation letters before the school year ends. Securing these early can help reduce stress in the fall.

Summer Planning – Summer experiences, such as internships, jobs, or volunteer work, can strengthen college applications and provide great material for essays and interviews. Now is the time to secure opportunities! <u>Here is a link</u> to resources we have available on our webpage. By staying proactive, both seniors and juniors can set themselves up for success in the college admissions process. Encourage your student to stay on track, ask questions, and take advantage of available resources!

Making the Most of Your College Visits

In our last newsletter, we highlighted the many benefits of visiting college campuses. Now that spring is here, it's a great time to start planning these visits and making the most of each experience. Whether your student is just beginning their college search or finalizing their decision, here are some ways to ensure a productive and insightful visit:

✓ Schedule a Campus Tour – Many colleges offer both in-person and virtual tours. Be sure to sign up in advance to secure a spot.

✓ Sit in on a Class – If possible, have your student attend a class in their intended major to get a feel for the academic environment.

✓ Explore Student Life – Dining halls, residence halls, and student centers are great places to observe campus culture and see if it's a good fit.

✓ Meet with Admissions & Financial Aid – Encourage your student to ask questions about scholarships, financial aid, and admission requirements.

 \checkmark Take Notes & Compare – After each visit, jot down impressions of the campus, student interactions, and overall feel. This can be helpful when making a final decision.

Visiting colleges is an exciting step in the process and can provide valuable clarity for your student. Start local, explore options, and take advantage of upcoming open houses or admitted student days!


